

In 2013 WSF launched our Ensuring the Future of Wild Sheep program that included the establishment of the Chadwick Ram Society (CRS), and the formation of the Wild Sheep Legacy Foundation (WSLF) as a separate entity to manage and grow the foundation's Endowment Fund.

To date, 488 members have joined the Chadwick Ram Society generating \$2,600,000 to support WSF's mission and purpose. And, through WSF member support, planned giving, major gifts, society contributions, and sound WSLF Board of Trustee management, we have grown the WSLF Endowment Fund from \$5.7 million in January 2013 to \$14.7 million in August 2024.

During this same period WSF has increased our Mission Program Funding, which are dollars to support our conservation, advocacy, and education mission, more than two-fold from \$4.3 million directed to grant in aid and other mission programs during the 2013-14 fiscal year to more than \$11 million during our 2023-24 fiscal year!

Additionally, a monumental milestone was achieved during our January 2024 convention when we fully subscribed the planned 100 member Marco Polo Society (MPS) when ten dedicated and altruistic Marco Polo Society members combined resources to buy the final MPS #100 membership for an astonishing \$1 million bid! With this unmatched support the 100 Marco Polo Society members have contributed \$10.9 million dollars to benefit wild sheep, their habitat, as well as support WSF's future by building our endowment.

With an eye to WSF's long term future, we are pleased to announce two new programs, Today, Tomorrow, & Forever for Wild Sheep and the "Keep Climbing" Campaign.

TODAY, TOMORROW, & FOREVER FOR WILD SHEEP

Today:

WSF casts a very long conservation shadow. No other organization of our kind or size raises and directs more money to mission programs than the Wild Sheep Foundation. No one. This what we do for wild sheep Today.

Tomorrow:

WSF's Conservation Fund, Life Member Fund, and other restricted funds ensure WSF has the resources and flexibility to fund novel initiatives, large investments in sheep habitat or restoration, and take advantage of mission related opportunities when they present themselves. These are funding reserves for Tomorrow.

Forever:

And finally, funding for the future. For every \$1 million dollars directed to the Endowment Fund, through a 4% sustainable contribution, WSF will annually receive \$40,000 to fund wild sheep conservation and mission programs in perpetuity – even long after most of us are gone. This is Forever funding.

Mountain Royalty Society TM pledges can be paid one-time, quarterly over four years, or annually over ten years.

MOUNTAIN ROYALTY SOCIETY GIVING LEVELS



Ruby - \$125,000

One time, four payments of \$31,250 or ten payments of \$12,500 Current MPS members may add \$25,000 to their paid in full or \$100,000 MPS pledge. Example, a paid in full MPS member can Keep Climbing by joining the MRS as a Ruby level for a one-time gift of \$25,000, four annual gifts of \$6,250 or ten annual gifts of \$2,500. Or, current MPS members can add \$2,500 annually to their current 10-year pledge.



Emerald - \$150,000

One time, four payments of \$37,500 or ten payments of \$15,000 Current MPS members may add \$50,000 to their paid in full or \$100,000 MPS pledge. Example, a paid in full MPS member can Keep Climbing by joining the MRS as an Emerald level for a one-time gift of \$50,000, four annual gifts of \$12,500 or ten annual gifts of \$5,000. Or, current MPS members can add \$5,000 annually to their current 10-year pledge.



Diamond - \$200,000

One time, four payments of \$50,000 or ten payments of \$20,000 Current MPS members may add \$100,000 to their paid in full or \$100,000 MPS pledge. Example, a paid in full MPS member can Keep Climbing by joining the MRS as a Diamond level for a one-time gift of \$100,000, four annual gifts of \$25,000 or ten annual gifts of \$10,000. Or, current MPS members can add \$10,000 annually to their current 10-year pledge.

Area of Greatest Need

Funds annual Grant In Aid and other mission program funding

WSF Conservation Fund

A quasi-endowed fund. Up to 4% annual distribution of 36-month corpus and earnings to fund WSF Grant In Aid and other mission program funding. To penetrate corpus to fund a pressing need requires a 2/3 majority vote of board of directors.

WSLF Endowment Fund

A fully endowed fund. Up to 4% annual distribution of 36-month corpus and earnings to fund WSF Grant In Aid and other mission program funding. Corpus can never be penetrated. 4% distribution from earnings and interest only. Donors may endow specific programs. Ask for details.
